- Approval of September 22, 2015 minutes, p. 1 2
   Pete Wade moved to approve the minutes; Kris Long seconded the motion, which passed unanimously.
- NUTR 221N Basic Human Nutrition (revision) p. 3-5
   APPROVED
   Kris Long explained the proposal to revise this course. Don Hickethier moved to approve the proposal; Sharon Nau, on behalf of Brenda Hanson, seconded the motion, which passed unanimously.

- MUSI 112 Choir: Glacier Chorale (new) p. 34-36
   Nicole Sanford explained the proposal to add this course. Sharon Nau, on behalf of Brenda Hanson, moved to approve the proposal; Don Hickethier seconded the motion, which passed unanimously.
- MUST 115 Introduction to Digital Music (revision) p. 39-40
   Nicole Sanford explained the proposal to revise this course. Sharon Nau, on behalf of Brenda Hanson, suggested offering it intermittently until the course is more established. Brad Eldredge moved to approve the proposal, with the change of it being offered intermittently; Myrna Ridenour seconded the motion, which passed unanimously.

- WLDG 111 Welding Theory I Practical (revision) p. 46-48
   Pete Wade explained the proposal to remove the prerequisite from this course. Don Hickethier moved to approve the proposal; Sharon Nau, on behalf of Brenda Hanson, seconded the motion, which passed unanimously.
- Tier II Course Splits, p. 49-50
  Pete Wade explained the proposal to split these courses into their lecture/lab components on behalf of the RevUp Grant. Discussion followed regarding the consequences of having courses that are not whole numbers of credits. Pete Wade moved to table the two courses with fractional credits. Sharon Nau, on behalf of Brenda Hanson, moved to approve the proposal; Lowell Jaeger seconded the motion, which passed unanimously.
- Graduation Requirement Substitution, p. 51-53
   Don Hickethier amended the form to designate that the math substitution is for a quantitative literacy related instruction requirement, rather than a specific course. The writing graduation substitution is asking to fulfill a communications related instruction requirement. Pete Wade moved to approve the proposal; Lowell Jaeger seconded the motion, which passed unanimously.

- AHMA 101 Introduction to Medical Assisting, AHMA 230 Advanced Medical Office
   Procedures, AHMA 280 Medical Assisting Exam Preparation (new) p. 58-67 APPROVED
   Karla West explained recent changes to the Medical Assisting program and Chris
   Degenhardt explained the proposal to add these courses. Pete Wade moved to approve the
   proposal; Kris Long seconded the motion, which passed unanimously.
- AHMA 298 Medical Assisting Externship (revision) p. 68-71 APPROVED Karla West explained the proposal to revise this course so the lab fee covers the cost of students' certification exam. Discussion followed about students paying the fee for taking the test after the semester is over. Other programs on campus use a similar structure. Discussion followed about how long the college is willing to hold students' lab fee in case a student doesn't take the test within the three-month window. Pete Wade recommended specifying in the syllabus that students must take the test within three months of completing of the course. Pete Wade moved to approve the proposal; Kris Long seconded the motion, which passed with one abstention.
