# 1. Executive Staff Activities Report

The Board of Trustees thanked the Executive Staff for their informative reports. Trustees noted all the hard work faculty and staff do every day to continue to make FVCC an amazing place for students.

#### C. Commissioner of Higher Education Report

Erik Rose, Compliance and Workforce Data Analyst, from the Commissioner of Higher Education's Office presented the Board with an update on recent workforce development efforts in the state. The state has been working on workforce development to help address the looming workforce shortage. It was noted that 24% of the employed workforce is expected to retire within the next ten years, which is going to create a workforce shortage as there are not enough students and workers to replace the expected 120,000 retirements in the next ten years. Some of the workforce development efforts to help bridge this gap include a \$1.3 million U.S. Department of Labor Apprenticeship Expansion Grant. This grant will help continue to develop 20 new projects blending college learning with apprenticeships, provide opportunities for apprentices and National Guard service members to earn college credit for prior learning experiences, expand apprenticeship programs and management. In addition, work continues on the HealthCARE Montana grant that is focused on expanding rural healthcare access. Under the HealthCARE Montana grant, apprenticeships in 14 health occupations have been created and 84 people have been placed into these new apprenticeships.

#### V. COLLEGE ISSUES

Start welding classes.

#### A. Student Success: Teacher Camp/Teacher Welding Camp

Pete Wade, Director, Career and Technical Education, presented the Board with an update on the recent Teacher Camp and Teacher Welding Camp. Teacher camp was offered again this summer, the compressed two-week schedule allows teacher to mix and match classes to earn one to four college credits in just two-weeks. Four college credits for participants satisfies all sixty required Office of Public Instruction renewal requirements for teachers. This year's camp saw fifty participants who participated in ten different classes. In addition, twenty-three high school welding teachers participated in the Welding Teachers Camp. During this week long camp, welding teachers were able to complete their training requirements by participating in a one-week

class (M-F, 8:00-5:00). The course will equip teachers with the skills needed to teach Running

#### **B.** Firearms Finishing Certificate Program

On May 30, 2017, the Curriculum Committee voted to approve a new certificate program in Firearms Finishing. The Board is being presented with the recommended program for review and approval. Following review of the recommended new program, <u>Trustee Kelly Stimpson moved that the Board approve the Firearms Finishing Certificate Program</u>. <u>Trustee Stephanie Wallace seconded the motion</u>. With no further discussion, <u>Trustee Tom McElwain</u> called for the question, the motion carried unanimously with seven (7) "yes" votes.

#### C. Inter-local Agreement-Tennis Facility

The Board is being presented with Interlocal Agreement, Tennis Facility for review and approval. The agreement is for use of the campus tennis facility. The governing bodies of Flathead Valley Community College, Kalispell School District #5, City of Kalispell and the Flathead Tennis association must sign the Interlocal Agreement based upon MCA 7-11-104. Following review of the Interlocal Agreement, Trustee Mark Holston moved that the Board approve the execution of the agreement as presented. Trustee Tom McElwain seconded the motion. With no further discussion, the motion carried unanimously with seven (7) "yes" votes.

## D. Finance and Audit Committee Update

Trustee Peter Akey, noted that the Finance and Audit Committee did not meet prior to the meeting but that the Board did an in depth review of the budget during the Board Retreat prior to the meeting. The Board discussed at length the 2018 proposed budget.

## E. Fiscal Year 2018 Proposed Budget (First Public Hearing)

The budget plan for Fiscal Year 2018 (First Reading) was developed and submitted to the Board for review and action. President Karas indicated that this is the first public reading of the budget and it will again be brought before the Board at the July Trustees meeting for a second reading. Following lengthy review of the budget during a Board Retreat held prior to the Board meeting, Trustee Peter Akey moved that the Board of Trustees approve the Fiscal Year 2018 Proposed Budget of \$19,984,393, with a continuing education budget of \$675,000, including \$645,000 for the Kalispell campus and \$30,000 for the Lincoln County Campus in Libby. Trustee Mark Holston seconded the motion. With no further discussion, the motion carried unanimously with seven (7) "yes" votes.

#### F. Board of Trustees Events Calendar

President Karas reviewed the Trustees events calendar and noted that she recently finished her annual Community Conversations. The college will be closed in observance of the Independence Day Holiday on July 4. The foundation will be hosting a Festival event on Flathead Lake, Summer Fest, on July 13. The next regularly scheduled Board meeting is Monday, July 24. The Governor's Cup Dinner will once again be held on the FVCC campus on July 27. An all employee in-service will be held on Monday, August 23, prior to the start of fall classes. Students will move into student housing on August 25, with Fall classes beginning on August 28.

## G. President's Update

President Karas updated the Board on several items:

- President Karas reported that student housing continues to be on schedule for a move-in day of August 25. All units' vinyl tile flooring will be finished this week, landscaping will start July 5 and be completed by August 5. Furniture delivery and installation is scheduled for the week of July 24 and all low voltage cabling is to be completed this week.
- President Karas reported that she has completed her annual Community Conversations.
- Big Night was held on June 9. The event helped raise an estimated \$20,000 in scholarship funds for students to be able to attend the Venice Study Abroad Program along with other study abroad programs the college offers.
