C. Executive Staff Activities Report

Faculty Activities Report

The Board of Trustees thanked the Executive Staff for their informative reports. Trustees and President Karas noted all the hard work faculty and staff do every day to continue to make FVCC an amazing place for students.

V. COLLEGE ISSUES

A. Student Success: Student Food Pantry

Wendy Jeschke, Coordinator, Student Engagement, presented the Board with an update on the Student Food Pantry. The Student Food Pantry is located in the Learning Resource Center, Room 109. The pantry opened in January 2018 after Student Government did a study on students and their related food insecurity. Student Government had found that 51% of the student population at FVCC skipped meals and 57% indicated that they did not have the resources to acquire food for themselves or their families. During the spring semester, the pantry received 1,085.9 pounds of food and distributed 979.50 pounds while serving 81 individuals. The food pantry, in conjunction with Student Government, held pop up peanut butter and jelly stations during the semester, made several food baskets over the holidays, helped individuals with SNAP applications and provided some Speed Seal meals. The pantry received donations through canned food drives and purchased food through funds donated via donation jars that are placed throughout campus. From the opening of the pantry in January 2018, through January 2020, the pantry had 279 total visits from students and their dependents. During the closure due to the COVID-19 pandemic, the pantry was able to continue serving students through online requests and scheduled appointments.

B. Board Meeting Schedule for Fiscal Year 2020

The Board was presented with the Board meeting schedule for Fiscal Year 2021. President Karas noted that should any dates need to be changed in the future adjustments can be made and noticed as required. <u>Trustee Kelly Stimpson moved that the Board approve the Board meeting schedule for Fiscal Year 2021 as presented.</u> <u>Trustee Mark Holston seconded the motion.</u> With no further discussion, the motion carried unanimously with seven (7), "yes" votes.

C. Enter Final Agreement for Debt Service Promissory Note Relating to College Center

Three proposals for the promissory note relating to the College Center were received by the May 12, 2020 deadline. Following review of all proposals received, the Board is being asked to authorize President Karas to enter into negotiations and final agreement with Trail West Bank for the Promissory Note relating to the debt service required to complete construction of the College Center project as set forth and authorized under Section 20-15-301, M.C.A.

Trustee Kelly Stimpson moved that the Board authorize President Karas to be the signatory on behalf of the college and enter into negotiations and final agreement with Trail West Bank for the Promissory Note related to the debt service required to complete construction of the College

<u>Center project, pending legal review as deemed necessary.</u> <u>Trustee Mark Holston seconded the motion.</u> With no further discussion, <u>the motion carried with six (6), "yes" votes, Trustee Peter Akey abstained.</u>

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D. Trustees Events Calendar

President Karas reviewed the Trustees events calendar and noted that the next Board of Regents meeting is scheduled for May 20 and has been changed to a virtual meeting. The next regularly scheduled Board meeting is scheduled for Monday, June 22, and that it could be possible that it will be another virtual meeting depending on the state's guidelines to reopening. The college is looking at alternatives to this years' Summer Fest that was originally scheduled for July 9, as Flathead Lake Lodge has cancelled all of their events for the summer.

E. President's Update

President Karas updated the Board on several items:

- FVCC graduated its 52nd class with a virtual commencement on Friday, May 17.
- The Accreditation Exit meeting was well attended despite being a virtual meeting. The accreditation team was pleased with the participation of the entire campus community. The college received five commendations and five recommendations that will be reviewed once the peer evaluation report is received.
- The Encore campaign will begin again after a slight pause due to recent closures and changes due to the Covid-19 pandemic.
- President Karas noted that a meeting was held on May 26, in Helena on continued discussion of the Community College Funding Formula. Unfortunately, the community colleges were not able to participate during this meeting, but will have an opportunity to speak and be a part of the conversation at an upcoming meeting.
- President Karas has put together a task force to discuss and prepare for the upcoming semesters in regards to the ever changing requirements of Covid-19. The task force will look at the safest and best ways to continue to offer the highest quality education to students.

VI. REORGANIZATION OF BOARD OF TRUSTEES

A. Appoint Board Members to Positions of Board Chair, Board Vice-Chair and Secretary to the Board

Chairperson Lund called for the reorganization of the Board of Trustees and opened the meeting to nominations for Chairperson of the Board. <u>Trustee Kelly Stimpson moved that the Board of Trustees appoint Shannon Lund as Chairperson of the Board. Trustee Mark Holston seconded the motion.</u> With no other nominations, <u>the motion to appoint Shannon Lund as Chairperson of the Board of Trustees carried with seven (7) "yes" votes.</u>

Chairperson Lund called for nominations for the position of Vice-Chairperson of the Board of Trustees. <u>Trustee Kelly Stimpson moved that the Board of Trustees appoint Callie Langohr as Vice-Chairperson of the Board.</u> <u>Trustee Peter Akey seconded the motion.</u> With no other nominations, <u>the motion to appoint Callie Langohr for the position of Vice-Chairperson of the Board carried with seven (7) "yes" votes.</u>

Chairperson Lund called for nominations for the position of Secretary to the Board. Trustee Kelly Stimpson moved that the Board of Trustees appoint Kelly Stimpson as Secretary to the Board. Trustee Pete Akey seconded the motion. With no other nominations, the motion to appoint Kelly Stimpson as Secretary to the Board of Trustees carried with seven (7) "yes" votes.

B. Appoint a Clerk of the District Trustee Kelly Stimpson moved that the Board of Trustees reappoint Monica Settles as Clerk of the District. Trustee Mark Holston seconded the motion. With no other appointees, the motion carried unanimously with seven (7) "yes" votes. On their heels comes thirteen teacher candidates who are completing their level two 10 capstone projects this week. The graduates from the past have set a high bar and local 11 administrators are looking to these graduates as future employees. The EDEC program is graduating four AAS degree students this spring. While we can't celebrate with them in person, 12 13 we celebrate them for their accomplishment! 14 Eliza Thomas is finishing her first year of doctoral work with a class in the History of Children's 15 Literature. This semester through virtual delivery, she's been able to share her learning with her 16 17 FVCC students taking EDU 231 Children's Literature for Elementary. This summer, Eliza will be 18 taking two more courses in her journey toward her terminal degree. 19 20 Stephanie Paidas - Assistant Professor - Psychology 21 Dr. Stephanie Paidas has continued to support psychology students and the Social Sciences division through the struggles of remote instruction and online learning. Her skills as a licensed 22 23 psychotherapist have come in very handy during this time! 24 25 Dr. Paidas has also recently contributed her research skills to several ad hoc reviews of scientific 26 papers for peer-reviewed psychology journals. 27 **Christina Relvea - Associate Professor - Natural Resources** 28 The Natural Resources Department (C. Relyea, T. Eichner, and J. Fraley) has worked together 29 30 with the U. S. Forest Service, Glacier National Park, Montana Fish, Wildlife and Parks, and other entities to place a number of students in natural resources jobs for the summer. This is a great 31 32 opportunity for these students and reflects well on FVCC's program as well as the quality of our 33 students. The jobs include wildlife restoration, wildlife management, state parks management,

forestry, and fisheries field biology. Placing students in good jobs in their field of study is one

measure of how well an institution prepares and advocates for students.

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
