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A. Student Success: MUS YouMatter Campaign

Mandee Johnson, Mental Health Counselor/Advisor provided the Board with a report on the YouMatter MUS campaign that raises awareness about student mental health and promotes resources available to MUS students and employees in addressing health and wellness needs. The YouMatter MUS campaign was created out of work from the MUS Suicide Prevention and Mental Health Task Force aimed at addressing and responding to increased mental health needs during the COVID-19 pandemic. During this time, MUS institutions noted seeing more students with mental health needs that were more challenging to identify and it was harder to reach these students due to the remote and altered environments created by the pandemic. The support provides students and employees with resources which include a mental health wellness app (You@FVCC), an online referral platform (ThrivingCampus) and a virtual mental health literacy and suicide prevention training (Kognito). Partnerships with Montana mental health provides has also created a network of professionals for students to easily access and reach out to in times of need. The list of these professionals is listed on the ThrivingCampus website and shared with students and staff across the Montana University System.

B. Healthcare Core, CTS Program Approval

On April 30, the Curriculum Committee approved a new Healthcare Core, CTS Program. The Board was presented with the new program for review and approval. Chris Clouse, Vice President of Academic and Student Affairs, noted that the program was created as a path for students to take more focused prerequisites for higher level healthcare programs. Following review, Trustee Kelly Stimpson moved that the Board of Trustees approve the Healthcare Core, CTS Program. Trustee Mark Holston seconded the motion. With no further discussion, the motion carried unanimously with seven (7) "yes" votes.

C. Board Policy, Chapter VII, Students, Section 10, Admissions (First Reading)

The Board was presented with Board Policy, Chapter VII, Students, Section 10, Admissions (First Reading) for review and approval. President Karas noted that the policy is being updated to coordinate with state and federal laws and Montana University System (MUS) admission requirements. Following review, Trustee Lyle Mitchell moved that the Board of Trustees approve Board Policy, Chapter VII, Students, Section 10, Admissions (First Reading). Trustee Callie Langohr seconded the motion. With no further discussion, the motion carried unanimously with seven (7) "yes" votes.

D. Board Policy, Chapter VII, Students, Section 60, Code of Student Conduct and Student Complaints (First Reading)

The Board was presented with Board Policy, Chapter VII, Students, Section 60, Code of Student Conduct and Student Complaints (First Reading) for review and approval. Following review, Trustee Mark Holston moved that the Board approve Board Policy, Chapter VII, Students, Section 60, Code of Student Conduct and Student Complaints (First Reading). Trustee Peter Akey seconded the motion. With no further discussion, the motion carried unanimously with seven (7) "yes" votes.

E. Revision of Board Policy, Chapter I, Doctrine, Section 111, COVID-19 Face Covering (First Reading)

Based on recent guidance from the CDC and recommendations from FVCC's COVID Quick Response Team (QRT), President Karas has lifted FVCC's current mask mandate.

- 1 With the recent guidance from the CDC and the MUS recommendation that individual campuses
- 2 set their own guidance, by the MUS Healthy Task Force, the Board is being asked to suspend
- 3 Board Policy, Chapter I, Doctrine, Section 111, COVID 19 Face Coverings. President Karas
- 4 noted that the Board had approved the policy in December 2020 when mask mandates were in
- 5 place but at the time of approval, the Board gave authority for President Karas to change or
- 6 rescind the policy as needed. President Karas suspended the policy on May 13 due to CDC
- 7 guidelines and is asking the Board to formally suspend the COVID-19 Face Coverings policy.
- 8 Trustee Peter Akey moved that the Board approve the revision of Board Policy, Chapter I,
- 9 Doctrine, Section 111, COVID-19 Face Covering. Trustee Lyle Mitchell seconded the motion.
 - With no further discussion, the motion carried unanimously with seven (7) "yes" votes.

F. Trustees Events Calendar

President Karas reviewed the Trustees events calendar and noted that the next regularly scheduled Board meeting is Monday, June 28. The Board will hold a workshop retreat on Friday, June 18. The college will be closed on Monday, May 31, in observance of the Memorial Day Holiday and on Monday, July 5, in observance of Independence Day. The Governor's Cup Dinner is scheduled to be held on the FVCC campus on Thursday, July 29, all Board members will be invited to attend. All Employee In-Service is scheduled for Monday, August 23 and Fall Semester classes begin on Wednesday, August 25.

G. President's Update

President Karas updated the Board on several items:

- HB 102, a law that would expand permissions for concealed carry firearms on college campuses is scheduled to take effect on Monday, June 1. The college is currently working on a policy that would need to take immediate effect. The Board of Regents held a special meeting last week to decide if they will request a judicial review of the law to clarify the Regents constitutional authority to supervise, coordinate, manage and control the presence and use of firearms on MUS campuses. The Board may need to hold a special board meeting to approve a concealed carry firearms policy should the courts not have a ruling prior to the June 1 effective date.
- Commencement was held on Friday, May 7. It was nice to be able to be in-person to celebrate the success of all of FVCC's graduates.
- The Nursing Pinning Ceremony was held Friday, May 7, in AT 139. Limited guests and attendees were allowed at the event but it was a wonderful event celebrating our nursing students.
- Springfest was held May 20-21. Final numbers have not been calculated but the event helped raised money for student scholarships.
- The College Center construction continues with completion planned for late spring of 2022. As the weather improves and more progress is completed a tour will be scheduled for the Board.

VI. REORGANIZATION OF BOARD OF TRUSTEES

A. Appoint Board Members to Positions of Board Chair, Board Vice-Chair and Secretary to the Board

Chairperson Lund called for the reorganization of the Board of Trustees and opened the meeting to nominations for Chairperson of the Board. Trustee Mark Holston moved that the

Board of Trustees appoint Peter Akey as Chairperson of the Board and Trustee Shannon Lund moved that the Board appoint Callie Langohr as Chairperson of the Board. Trustees voted by ballot and with a 4-3 vote Trustee Peter Akey was elected Chairperson of the Board.

Chairperson Lund called for nominations for the position of Vice-Chairperson of the Board of Trustees. Trustee Mark Holston moved that the Board of Trustees appoint Callie Langohr as Vice-Chairperson of the Board. Trustee Callie Langohr declined and nominated Trustee Kelly Stimpson to the position of Vice-Chair. With no other nominations, the Board elected Kelly Stimpson for the position of Vice-Chairperson of the Board.

Lund called for nominations for the position of Secretary to the Board. Trustee Mark Holston and Lyle Mitchell both nominated Trustee Patrick Gulick to the position of Secretary to the Board. With no other nominations, the Board elected Trustee Patrick Gulick Secretary to the Board of Trustees.

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B. Appoint a Clerk of the District

Trustee Peter Akey moved that the Board of Trustees reelect Monica Settles as Clerk of the District. Trustee Shannon Lund seconded the motion. With no other appointees, the Board elected Monica Settles as Clerk of the District.

Informational slides and posts were created and posted throughout the month. A "Walk the Walk" event was held on April 15 from 11:00 am 10 11 to 2:00 pm. Students and employees enjoyed a mile-long trail on campus that incorporated a variety of informational signs pertaining to healthy relationships, affirmative consent, and by-12 stander intervention. All participants were given a brief survey and entered to win a Fitbit 13 Charge 4. An awareness campaign took place on April 28th to promote Denim Day. Students 14 15 were encouraged to wear jeans with a purpose, support survivors, and educate themselves and 16 others about all forms of sexual violence. 17 18 Stress Less Day was hosted on April 29 from 11:00 am to 2:00 pm on the lawn in front of the AT 19 building. The event included interactive, educational stations on physical fitness, nutrition, 20 mindfulness, sleep, and play (3 physical therapy dogs). The event attracted 56 students. 21 Student Government hosted their spring election on April 21st and provided free lunch to 22 everyone that voted. They will start the fall semester with 6 members. An Earth Day trivia event 23 was hosted on April 15th. 24 25 26 Events hosted by the Student Engagement Office included Grocery Bingo Night, Make Your 27 Own Monday, and a service project at the Community Kitchen.
