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SECTION 10: NAMING OF CAMPUS BUILDINGS

Approved: February 17, 2004

POLICY

I. NAMING OF BUILDINGS

College buildings may be named for academic fields or functions, for geographical regions, features or subjects relating to Montana, for significant persons in Montana history, or for individuals or organizations who have made significant contributions to the growth and development of the College.

II. BOARD APPROVALS

The Board of Trustees shall request the President to appoint an ad-hoc naming committee representative of the College community and the general public. This committee will make recommendations to the President for his/her presentation to the Board. The Board of Trustees will name College buildings at regularly scheduled Board meetings.

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SECTION 30: USE OF COLLEGE FACILITIES (Flathead and Lincoln County Campuses)

USE OF COLLEGE FACILITIES AND PROPERTY POLICY

This Policy is designed to provide guidance for the use of College facilities and property. Primarily, FVCC facilities and property are intended for academic uses. Other uses may occur utilizing the reservation and rental procedures as approved by the President or his/her designee.

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SECTION 40: CRISIS MANAGEMENT PLAN

CRISIS MANAGEMENT PLAN POLICY

The President and/or his/her designee will establish an institutional crisis management plan and on a regular basis disseminate such a plan to all employees and students for the purposes of providing a safe and secure campus, to effectively manage emergency situations, and to minimize injury to people and damage to property.

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SECTION 50: SUSPENDED OPERATIONS

Adopted: July 23, 2001

SUSPENDED OPERATIONS POLICY

In the event of an emergency situation adversely affecting College operations, public health, or the well-being and safety of students, faculty or other employees, the President or his/her designee may declare a temporary suspension of any or all operations of the institution. Emergency situations that might affect such a suspension include, but are not limited to, pandemics, severe weather conditions, natural disaster, fire or related hazard, and mechanical or equipment failure. The College's normal policy is to remain open during inclement weather.

CAMPUS CRIME AND SECURITY POLICY

Flathead Valley Community College is committed to a crime and violent free environment. The President and/or his/her designee will establish appropriate procedures to ensure a safe and secure campus.

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SECTION 70: NO CAMPING POLICY

Approved: June 27, 2016

NO CAMPING POLICY

No camping or overnight parking is allowed on FVCC property, except as may be approved by the President or his/her designee. “Camping” means that it reasonably appears, in light of all the circumstances, that a facility or outdoor space is being used for living accommodation purposes such as overnight sleeping; making preparations for overnight sleeping (including the laying down of bedding for the purpose of sleeping and/or erection of a tent or other shelter); making any fire for cooking; or using or preparing to use tents, motor vehicles, or other structures for sleeping and/or cooking.
