

Commercial Driver’s License (CDL) Licensure Disclosure

Upon completion of [HEO 103 Professional Truck Driver](#), students will learn the skills necessary to obtain a Class “A” CDL learner’s permit through classroom instruction. This course also includes the driving experience necessary for students to pass the pre-trip, skills, and driving exam for the Montana Class “A” CDL. In addition, students will receive the necessary training to obtain School Bus and Passenger endorsements.

With an unrestricted Class “A” license, the Montana CDL license holder (over 21) can drive in all 50 states and the District of Columbia. If a CDL license holder moves to another state, the license holder will typically need to transfer the CDL to the new state. Usually, the CDL license holder will not need to redo testing in the new state, but there may be new CDL license transfer fees.
