B. Finance and Audit Committee Report

President Karas reported that the Finance and Audit Committee met prior to the Board meeting for a thorough review of the preliminary Fiscal Year 2026 budget.

1. Fiscal Year 2026 Proposed Budget – First Public Hearing

The budget plan for Fiscal Year 2026 (First Reading) was developed and submitted to the Board for review and action. President Karas stated that this is the first public reading of the budget, and it will be presented before the Board at the July 28th meeting for a second reading.

Trustee Peter Akey moved that the Board of Trustees approve the Preliminary Fiscal Year 2026 Proposed Current Unrestricted (General Fund) budget (First Reading) of \$25,797,097. Trustee Jamie Pickering seconded the motion. The motion carried unanimously.

C. Board of Trustees' Events Calendar

President Karas reviewed the Trustees' events calendar. The college will be closed on Friday, July 4th in observance of Independence Day. The Foundation's Summer Soiree will be on July 9th in Whitefish at The Patio. The next Board meeting will be on July 28th.

D. President's Report

President Karas updated the Board on several items:

- ACCT Certificate FVCC received a Member of Good Standing Award from the Association of Community College Trustees for 2025.
- President's Report The annual President's Report publication has been completed, this year's theme is "Year of Impact."
- President's Circle Dinner The annual dinner was held on June 19th in McClaren Hall at the Wachholz College Center. Justin and Jennifer Sliter were the recipients of the Eagle Award and three transformation student scholarships were awarded. President Karas thanked everyone who was able to attend. She also expressed appreciation to the Culinary, Foundation and Marketing teams and the staff who volunteered to help make the evening a success.
- Position Searches The college has been conducting interviews for the positions of Executive Director of Institutional Research and Director of the Wachholz Innovation and Entrepreneurship Center. In addition, a new Director for the Lincoln County Campus has been hired and will start on July 7th.
- Legislative Update The Legislative Audit Committee recently met and reviewed our audit, there were no questions. President Karas will check to see if our auditor is able to present the audit at the July Board meeting.
- OCHE The Office of the Commissioner of Higher Education (OCHE) sent the
 proposed reversion numbers for what the funding formula would be, they are
 different than what the three community colleges had expected. Lorelle Davies,
 Vice President/Chief Financial Officer and President Karas will be meeting with a
 commissioner's office representative to go over the calculations.
- StoryCorps President Karas invited the Board to attend the National Public Radio StoryCorps free event tonight at 6:30 at the Wachholz College Center.
