Running Start provided swag and students enjoyed several hours on campus learning about a teaching strategy in early childhood, the EDEC program, and education overall. - Eliza also had the privilege of celebrating three EDEC AAS graduates as they completed their bachelor's degree from Salish Kootenai College. Students were able to receive their degree through a partnership and grant with the SKC early childhood department.
